

Technical Information Sheet

Forefront Pro is for control of annual and perennial broad-leaved weeds in established grassland for grazing by cattle and sheep only.

Key benefits

- Long-term control of broadleaved dock, curled dock, creeping thistle, spear thistle, common nettle, creeping buttercup, dandelion, ragwort and chickweed in established grassland.
- Grazing by sheep or cattle can resume 7 days after Forefront Pro application.
- A single well-timed application of Forefront Pro can control weeds for up to 18 months.

Best use advice

- Forefront Pro should only be used on established grassland fields grazed by cattle or sheep.
- Grazing by cattle or sheep can resume 7 days after treatment or when the foliage of any poisonous weeds, such as ragwort, has died and become unpalatable.
- Treated grass must not be cut for zero-grazing, silage, hay or haylage in the calendar year of treatment.
- Grass used for zero-grazing, silage, hay or haylage produced from the treated area in the following calendar year must stay on farm and manure from animals fed on this must stay on farm and be spread only onto agricultural grassland.
- For optimum control apply 2-3 weeks after cutting provided there is sufficient regrowth.
- · Apply through a tractor mounted hydraulic sprayer.
- Clover can be stitched in 4 months after application. Grass seed can be drilled 1 month after application.
- Forefront Pro contains aminopyralid which carries restrictions on use of manure and following crops.
 - Manure produced from animals fed from grass treated with Forefront Pro must stay on farm and should only be spread onto agricultural grassland.

Following crops:

- Only barley, wheat, oats, rye and maize can be grown in rotation following the harvest of crops treated with Forefront Pro.
- Oilseed rape can only be planted after 12 months after an application of Forefront Pro.
- Potatoes, sugar beet, fodder beet, vegetables, beans and other legumes can be planted in the second calendar year following Forefront Pro treatment.
- For optimum control, Forefront Pro should be applied to healthy, actively growing weeds at the appropriate growth stage.
