## **SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES**

#### 4.1 Description of first aid measures

#### General advice:

#### 5.2 Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture

**Hazardous combustion products:** During a fire, smoke may contain the original material in addition to combustion products of varying composition which may be toxic and/or irritating. #### 5.3 Advice for firefighters
